


What is the TIP? 25-yr LRTP

5-yr TIPSpecific & Accurate






What's required for adoption?

- TIP must show consistency with adopted LRTP
- Developed in coordination with FDOT & HART
- Include regionally significant projects
- Include highway & transit projects to be funded by FHWA or FTA
- Cost-feasible
- Developed in consultation with the public
- Criteria for prioritizing projects



What projects are in the TIP?



These projects are priorities that are under construction or have funding to begin construction within the next five years. It also includes partially funded projects, which are listed to show community support until they are completed.

These are projects that are important to the TPO but still needs funding, and are ranked in priority order from top to bottom. If funding is secured, candidates ordinarily are added to the fifth year of the TIP. This group is quite large. It includes Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) projects; local Capital Improvement Programs; and can include planning studies and miscellaneous projects.

Where do these projects come from?



Existing Priorities Funded for Construction

These projects are priorities that are under construction or have funding to begin construction within the next five years. It also includes partially funded projects, which are listed to show community support until they are completed.

- Projects on this list are priorities of the community & have received some construction funding
- Projects remain on this list until construction is complete



Where do these projects come from?



These are projects that are important to the TPO but still needs funding, and are ranked in priority order from top to bottom. If funding is secured, candidates ordinarily are added to the fifth year of the TIP.

Funding

- Projects on this list are considered priorities of the community
- Project rank corresponds to the anticipated effect each will have on a specific area of performance – more on this later
- Projects remain until funded



Where do these projects come from?

- Projects on this list include:
 - FDOT projects
 - Local jurisdiction projects
 - Planning studies & other projects that defy easy classification
- Local projects included for coordination purposes but not required
- TPO does not control which projects are funded with local dollars




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All Other Projects Funded in the Next Five Years

This group is quite large. It includes Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) projects; local Capital Improvement Programs; and can include planning studies and miscellaneous projects.

How are projects funded?

- For each priority, TPO suggests a funding source that best matches goals of the project, jurisdiction, and facility type
- Capital Improvement Programs typically funded with local dollars (TPO does not control these projects)





- Study of 122nd Ave bridge over Tampa Bypass Canal


Funding allocation by the project type

Funding recommendations

- TPO staff to review new priority projects & funding requests
- Project ranking will inform funding recommendations for programming in FY29
- FDOT to consider those recommendations for next work program cycle

When will the project get built?

With few exceptions, new additions to the priority list are seeking funding for FY29

Project urgency should be a consideration for the local governments

Regional coordination

- Transportation Regional Incentive Program (TRIP)
 Priorities
 - SCTPA reps to advocate for Big Bend West (US41 to Covington Garden Dr)
- Multi-Use Trail (MUT) Priorities
 - SCTPA reps to advocate for Tampa Bypass Canal Trail Segments 5 (Harney Rd to Fletcher Ave) and 6 (Fletcher Ave to Bruce B Downs Blvd)
- Major Projects



Milestones

- ✓May 15th: Draft made available to public for 30-day review
- ✓ May-June: Draft TIP and Priority List presented to committees for approval
- ✓End of May: Public notices published in newspapers, flyers mailed to affected areas, and roadside signs posted
- Compliance checks prior to final submittal to FDOT
