
MOU on Creating a Tampa Bay MPO

Tampa-St. Petersburg, FL Transportation Management Area



Legislation

By December 31, 2023, the M.P.O.'s serving Hillsborough, Pasco, and Pinellas, must submit to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives a **feasibility report exploring the benefits, costs, and process of consolidation into a single M.P.O.** serving the contiguous urbanized area, the goal of which is to:

- 1. Coordinate transportation projects deemed to be regionally significant
- 2. Review the impact of regionally significant land use decisions on the region.
- Review all proposed regionally significant transportation projects in the respective transportation improvement programs


Pros

- Build trust and collaboration
- Define the transportation agenda
- Compete more effectively with other regions for funding
- Align regional transportation with regional economic development
- Largest MPO in Florida

Cons

- Risk of smaller communities and neighborhoods losing influence
- Doesn't guarantee any more funding or change the need for operating funds for transit
- Could shift emphasis to regional projects instead of community safety, access and mobility needs
- Potential to weaken coordination between land use and transportation

Case Study: Rio Grande Valley, TX Re-Designation (2019)



- Merged 3 MPOs into the Rio Grande Valley MPO
- Goal: strengthen advocacy for State funding
- MOU signed by 2 Counties, 6 Cities, TX Governor
- Details voting membership; initial bylaws; intent to leave federal grant funds suballocated to each indiv. area

Creating Vibrant, Walkable Communities

Created as a way to reduce vehicle miles traveled and improve air quality, the ARC's **Livable Centers Initiative (LCI)** is a grant program that incentivizes local jurisdictions to re-envision their communities as vibrant, walkable places that offer increased mobility options, encourage healthy lifestyles and provide improved access to jobs and services.

Recommend striking whereas clause for accuracy.

The Florida MPO Advisory Council in consultation with FDOT negotiates the Planning Funds (PL) distribution formula statewide after each decennial Census.

Whereas, the Florida Department of Transportation has committed through its approved Planning Funds (PL) distribution formula in 2014 that any MPOs in Florida that merge will continue to receive the base amount of PL due to each MPO prior to the merger.

Regional MPO Apportionment Plan

- Consult and seek approval from local governments
- Create governing board scenarios including voting members and nonvoting advisors

NOTE: Concurrently updating Hillsborough TPO's Apportionment Plan to retain designation from 2023-2027 to the Board

Business Model

- Typical cash-flow and floating of expenditures for grant reimbursement
- Dues structures for bare-bones fiscal sustainability and for state/national leadership
- Seek approval from local governments

- Consultation with Local Governments
- MetroQuest Survey for the general public to weigh in on merger
- TPO Advisory Committees
