I. Call to Order, Pledge of Allegiance_(Timestamp 0:05:00)

Mayor Ross, called the meeting to order at 10:00 AM and led the pledge of allegiance. The meeting was held in person and virtually via WebEx.

II. Roll Call_ (Gail Reese, TPO Staff) (Timestamp 0:00:00)

A quorum was met in person.

A. Vote of Consent for Remote Member Participation.

Councilmember Maniscalco moved to allow remote participation, seconded by Commissioner Cohen; the voice vote passed unanimously.

Vice Chair Ross read Chair Myers's memo of absence.

III. Approval of Minutes (*Timestamp 0:07:09*) – March 8, 2023.

Vice Chair Ross sought a motion to approve the March 8, 2023 minutes. Councilmember Citro so moved, seconded by Commissioner Cohen; the voice vote passed unanimously.

- **IV. Public Comment on Agenda Items** (*Timestamp 0:00:00*) (30 minutes total, with up to 3 minutes per speaker) Additional comments made via <u>Social Media</u> and <u>Email</u> can be found at the end of these minutes.
 - **Michael Maurino** Executive Director of the West Shore Alliance. The Alliance provides a letter in support of the TIP Amendment for the safety improvements on Boy Scout Blvd. Received a note from International Plaza also provided support. This was started by citizens of the area as the intersection is very dangerous.
 - Chris Vela Commented on regionalizing the MPOs; there is already the SCTPA Board with the regional TPO/MPOs represented in existence. The MOU is not a "check box" item, and Mr. Vela is opposed to the combining of the MPOs/TPOs. The combined MPO would allow people from Pinellas and Pasco Counties to fund projects using Hillsborough tax dollars.

V. Committee Reports & Advance Comments (Rick Fernandez, CAC Chair; Gena Torres, TPO Staff; and Beth Alden, TPO Executive Director) (*Timestamp 0:12:19*)

A. CAC – April 5, 2023 (Rick Fernandez, CAC Chair)

- Action Items
 - TIP Amendments on the TPO Board agenda today, West Boy Scout Blvd and US 301. There
 was a lack of design features of the intersections provided.
 - Performance Targets for Pavement and Bridge Condition Travel Time Reliability was approved. Asked TPO Staff to explore the reliability of benefits of ramp metering on limited access facilities; to consider supplementary metrics to communicate a more holistic explanation of the factors impacting congestion and reliability; and to explore the health effects of congestion for those sitting in traffic jams.
- Put forth a resolution intended to publish the sense of the committee related to agency
 participation in support of requested committee action. Expect to have some action on this
 within a couple of months.
- Status Reports
 - o Bike Boulevard Presentation from Chris Vela. Well received and expressed appreciation of the mapping concept. Approved recommending publication of the report to the Board.
 - THEA connected vehicle pilot results
 - o City of Tampa Safe Streets and Roads for All Grant Implementation.

Other Committee Reports

Regarding the Board's two action items today, you've heard from the Citizens Advisory Committee, in addition, both the Technical Advisory and Intelligent Transportation Systems Committees received presentations on those two items.

The ITS Committee approved the TIP Amendment for W. Boy Scout Blvd & US 301 Traffic Signalization and Intersection Improvements with a discussion on whether signal preemption for emergency vehicles and the option of roundabouts were considered in the study.

The ITS Committee also approved the Performance Targets for Pavement and Bridge Condition and for Travel Time Reliability, commenting on how traffic flow has changed after the pandemic and the target should change in the coming years.

The TAC did not attain a quorum to take action; the committee did not pose any questions or concerns on either of the action items.

B. Public Comments Received Through Email & Social Media (Gena Torres, TPO Staff).

No Facebook comments were received.

On Twitter, in response to a post on bus accessibility, Kevin O'Hare complimented the cover photo of "Tampa legend" Arizona Jenkins.

In response to a post about the Tampa Streetcar, Daniel Brightls asked what HARTs ridership is for the entire transit network for the same 3 months.

And in a post about Tampa ranking in the top 15th for riskiest drivers, Sarah H asked about the safety ranking for pedestrians.

Emails were exchanged with Mr. George Niemann who requested that the full correspondence is shared with the TPO Board, and indeed it is included in your folder. The subject centers around better defining what is appropriate or inappropriate to include in meeting minutes, specifically social media posts. TPO staff will be sure to exclude extraneous commentary.

Mauricio Rosas submitted 3 emails:

- 1. He shared a letter to Federal Highway from the National Association of City Transportation Officials regarding Improving Safety for All Users on Federal Aid Projects. Mr. Rosas calls specific attention to the letter highlighting:
 - In the United States, "highways" are commonly thought of as high-speed, limited access roads designed for motor vehicle travel only. However, 70% of the National Highway and Federal-aid Highway Systems is not limited-access, and millions of people live, walk or roll, ride bikes, take transit, push strollers, go to work and school on these roadways. In many places, these streets are the main streets of a community—and Federal regulation and practice contributes to making them unsafe. By overhauling regulations the U.S. can remove impediments to rapidly saving lives on some of the most dangerous streets in the country.
- 2. Mauricio also emailed his opposition to forming a regional MPO. He included into the record a 1989 report commissioned by Governor Bob Martinez highlighting:
 - MPOs should be the lead agency for public transit investment.
 - FDOT should be funding capital transit projects.
 - The local jurisdiction should have taxing authority.
- 3. Mr. Rosas' last email was regarding I-275 north of downtown, Mr. Rosas emphasized the damage the highway has had on Tampa's historic neighborhoods causing illness, death, and displacing thousands. A video link was included from the Los Angeles DOT on the inequitable, long-lasting damage to their urban core neighborhoods due to highway building.

A letter of support was received from the City of Tampa for the action item regarding the TIP amendment for intersection and pedestrian improvements at Boy Scout Blvd and Manhattan Ave. The letter speaks to the number of serious injury crashes and praises the collaboration between

the City, TPO, FDOT and the business groups and residents who have all supported this much-needed project.

VII. Action Items

- A. TIP Amendment: West Boy Scout Blvd & US 301 Traffic Signalization and Intersection Improvements (Johnny Wong, TPO Staff) (Timestamp 0:22:55)
 - Reviewed project summaries.
 - Secure federal authorization from FHWA.
 - Went over project improvements. W Boy Scout Blvd. is the top priority in the TIP priority list. Initially put on the TIP as a signal project, was reevaluated as a major safety project.
 - The improvements on US 301 were reviewed and safety implications were noted. Will align trails as well.
 - Looked at financial breakdowns. All construction will be completed in FY24.
 - Went over Public Outreach of this amendment.
 - TAC did not have a quorum to approve but had positive comments. CAC did not approve due to a lack of design documents. ITS did approve.

Recommended Action: Approve the FY 22/23 TIP Amendment: W Boy Scout Blvd & US 301 Traffic Signalization and Intersection Improvements.

Comparative Report

Presentation: TIP Amendments April 2023

Discussion:

It was asked if the lack of information being provided to the CAC is a one-off and if that will be prevented in the future. TPO Staff is working very diligently on receiving as much documentation as possible prior to the meetings. It was asked that a presentation in the future be made on how to get signals and the warrants required. There is a manual on Uniform Traffic Devices that are required for traffic signals. Warrants can be overruled based on engineering judgment. It all comes down to the engineer's recommendation. Signals increase crashes but can mitigate severe or incapacitating crashes. It was asked if the same rules apply to two county or city roads. FDOT does not approve those, it would be the jurisdictions. FDOT would be the enforcement of the rules. It was asked if there is a list where everything is rated by where crashes occur. The TPO website has a lot of that information and can be provided. It was requested that that information be presented to the TPO Board on an annual basis.

Commissioner Cohen moved to approve the TIP Amendments; seconded by Commissioner Kemp. Roll call vote passed 14-0.

- B. Performance Targets for Pavement & Bridge Condition and Travel Time Reliability (Connor MacDonald, TPO Staff) (Timestamp 0:43:40)
 - Went over the background and due date of June 14, 2023.
 - Review of pavement and bridge condition evaluations
 - Pavement and bridge performance measures
 - Data used to calculate pavement and bridge conditions.
 - Previous Board action was in 2018 supported FDOT's targets and submitted a letter asking D7 to continue to invest in pavement & bridge conditions in order to exceed the statewide target.
 - Looked at the proportion of lane miles by maintaining agency: 59% Hillsborough County, 20% City of Tampa, 3% Plant City, 1% Temple Terrace, 17% FDOT // Proportion of bridges by maintaining agency: 50% FDOT, 33% Hillsborough County, THEA 9%, City of Tampa 4%, Turnpike Authority 2%, Other 2%.
 - Went over Pavement and Bridge Condition Measures meeting and/or exceeding in all areas
 - TIP Projects to Improve Pavement and Bridge Condition went over the projects.
 - Travel Time Reliability system performance went over what it means and how it is measured.
 - The TPO elected to establish its own targets in 2018 as reliability is trending downward across Hillsborough County and is projected to continue in the future.
 - Went over projects to improve reliability.

Recommended Action: Approve supporting the statewide Pavement & Bridge Condition Targets; transmit letter to FDOT requesting that NHS pavements & bridges continue to be maintained in

a condition exceeding the statewide target; approve establishing the Hillsborough-specific Travel Time Reliability Targets.

Presentation Slides: <u>Performance Targets for Pavement & Bridge Condition and Travel Time</u>
Reliability

Discussion:

It was pointed out that the presentation noted FDOT roads but the FAST Act had provisions for all roads and conditions. It was asked if the performance targets were for FDOT federal aid roads only or all federal aid roads; they are for the FDOT roads only. Clarification was asked about how Travel Time Reliability is measured. It would be collected at the same time over several weeks. It was noted that the number one impact on travel time reliability are crashes. It was brought up that the data is being collected differently by different providers. It could be from Blue Tooth-enabled devices registering on the network. Peak travel times are compared against non-peak travel times excluding holidays and weekends. It was asked if that information is available on a real-time basis. FDOT maintains the contracts with the vendors. Based on the TPO partnership, it is a lot of data and staff is using partners to assist in analyzing it. Smart cameras and lights are monitoring traffic along with the overhead notification boards. FDOT is currently in the process of redoing the signals, they have the ability to be programmed for emergency and transit prioritization both in the programming and manually. These are starting to come online now.

Commissioner Kemp moved to approve supporting the statewide Pavement & Bridge Condition Targets; transmit letter to FDOT requesting NHS pavements & bridges continue to be maintained in a condition exceeding the statewide target; approve establishing the Hillsborough-specific Travel Time Reliability Targets; seconded by Councilmember Maniscalco. The voice vote passes unanimously.

VIII. STATUS REPORTS

- A. **2050 Long Range Transportation Plan Initial Steps** (Vishaka Shiva Raman and Elizabeth Watkins, TPO Staff) (*Timestamp 1:03:38*)
 - Section 1 Initial Steps
 - Provided background on what the LRTP is updated every five years and it is a twentyfive-year plan.
 - Looked at the 2020 map with the population and employment.
 - Went over the population and employment growth and projections to 2050 by jurisdictions.
 - Showed the map showing the projections of where traffic volume will be in 2050 and went over the timeline of the update.
 - The three major pieces of the update are Public Engagement, cost Feasible Scenarios (local and regional), and Forecasting System Performance in 2050
 - Reviewed the major areas, what is needed, and how much it costs. Also look at freight needs and equity needs.
 - Section 2 Revenue Forecast

- Went over how it is estimated what the community can afford federal, state, and local.
- Looked at an example of possible project funding based on specific revenues.
- Showed existing funding sources.
- Went over possible unlevied sources for future consideration.
- Showed overview of Next Steps

Presentation: 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan Initial Steps and Revenue Forecast

Discussion:

There was a discussion around adding a \$0.01 sales tax. It was asked if there is consideration given to EV charging and the impact of EVs on the gas tax. It was suggested that TPO Staff reach out to Tampa Bay Water so that they see the growth projections being used for the LRTP. At this time, there is no consensus on the BOCC for future funding. There are going to be discussions on the reauthorization of the CIT. The gas tax is dwindling due to EV and vehicle efficiency. There was a discussion about the regional travel demand model; that information will be part of the LRTP.

- B. **Transportation Disadvantaged Program Update** (Joshua Barber, TPO Staff and Jerry Stickney, Interim Director Hillsborough County Sunshine Line) (*Timestamp 0:00:00*)
 - Provided a review of the Transportation Disadvantaged Program
 - Went over the Sunshine Line and the services provided
 - Looked at the role of the TPO Staff
 - Review of the System Evaluation, 5-Year Trip Trend, and TD Tampa Bay
 - Went over current challenges and opportunities

The *Technical Advisory Committee (TAC)* shall be responsible for considering safe access to schools in the review of transportation project priorities, long-range transportation plans and transportation improvement programs and shall advise the MPO on such matters. In addition, the TAC shall be responsible for assisting in the development of transportation planning work programs; coordinating transportation planning and programming; review of all transportation studies, reports, plans and/or programs, and making recommendations to the TPO that are pertinent to the subject documents based upon the technical sufficiency, accuracy, and completeness of and the needs as determined by the studies, plans and/or programs. The following have been nominated to serve on the TAC:

TIP Amendment: N Tampa St & N Florida Ave Urban Corridor Improvements

Summary:

This TIP amendment will impact the following project, noted below:

440511-2, N Tampa St & N Florida Ave from Floribraska Ave & from Palm Ave to MLK Blvd.

The purpose of this project is to add design phase funding in FY24 to upgrade the existing drainage system to reduce the regular street flooding and to make complete street improvements to the roadway.

The complete street improvements include relocating the curb line to generally narrow the lane widths to 11' and widen the sidewalks to 7' on both sides of Florida Avenue.

Creation of a 12' shared use path on the west side of Tampa Street and widening the sidewalk to 8' on the east side of Tampa Street. Bulb-outs will be constructed in areas with on-street parking at Columbus Drive and Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard on Florida Avenue.

New pedestrian crossings will be installed at 26th Avenue on Florida Avenue, and at Woodlawn Avenue and Indiana Avenue on Tampa Street.

This project also supports planned projects by HART, including a proposed Bus Rapid Transit system and a Light Rail extension.

Recommended Action:

Approve the TIP Amendment to add new federal funds for the design phase of N Tampa St & N Florida Ave from Floribraska Ave & from Palm Ave to Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard.

Unified Planning Work Program Update and Amendment

Summary:

The TPO annually reviews and periodically amends its Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) to reflect grant funding and budget changes. A few changes in the current 2-year UPWP are proposed now. Following approval by the Board of this amendment, grant funding amounts shown in the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) will also be updated to reflect the same changes. The changes include:

- Shifts in the allocation of Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) grant funds from Tasks 1 and 2 to Tasks 5 and 6 to reflect greater staff effort in public engagement and regional coordination.
- Addition of \$388,375 awarded by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for the Distributed Air Quality Monitoring Network Grant.
- Addition of \$46,033 of Planning funds (PL) and Surface Transportation Block Grant (SU) funds of \$59,172 that remained at the close-out of our FY22 grants, and an increase in the FY24 allocation of PL funds of \$13,655.

As background, the TPO's transportation planning functions are supported primarily by federal and state grants. These functions must be identified in advance for two fiscal years. The UPWP also documents the use of federal funds for metropolitan transportation planning conducted by other agencies, including FDOT and HART.

RESEARCH AGREEMENT BETWEEN HILLSBOROUGH COUNTY METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION, dba HILLSBOROUGH TRANSPORTATION PLANNING ORGANIZATION AND UNIVERSITY OF SOUTH FLORIDA

THIS RESEARCH AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is entered into as of the date of last signature by Hillsborough Transportation Planning Organization, ("Sponsor"), and The University of South Florida Board of Trustees, a public body corporate, for the University of South Florida, ("University"), in support of the project entitled "Distributed Air Quality Monitoring for Disadvantaged Communities Along I-275/I-4 Corridor." In consideration of their mutual promises and obligations, the parties agree as follows:

I. PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE: The period of performance under this Agreement begins **June 1, 2023** and ends **February 28, 2026.** This period may be modified by mutual written agreement of the parties.

II. WORK PLAN / PROJECT ADMINISTRATION: The University will perform the project activities described in the appended Attachment 1, Scope of Work, in compliance with all applicable laws, regulations, and University policies. Amy Stuart, PhD ("University Project Director") will direct the project for the University.

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III. COMPENSATION: Sponsor will compensate the University on a Fixed Price basis in an amount not to exceed \$100,000 for its conduct of the project. The budget is appended as Attachment 2. To receive payment, University will submit invoices signed by an authorized official of the University to Sponsor's Project Director, quarterly, in the amount of \$10,000 per quarter in Years 1 and 2, and \$6,667 per quarter for the three quarters comprising Year 3. Sponsor will remit payment to "University of South Florida" within 30 days after receipt of each invoice to:

University may retain any unobligated balances remaining at the end of the period of performance.

IV. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR/LIABILITY: The relationship of the parties is that of mutually independent contractors. Neither party nor any of its officers, agents, and employees becomes by virtue of this Agreement an officer, agent, or employee of the other party. Each party assumes the risk of all liability arising from its respective activities under this Agreement and from the acts or omissions of its own officers, agents, and employees. University's liability is as described in section 768.28, Florida Statutes.

V. TERMINATION: The parties may mutually terminate this Agreement at any time by written agreement. Either party may terminate this Agreement with or without cause upon no less than 30 days' prior written notice to the other party's administrative contact. Notice must be sent by certified mail, return receipt requested, or delivered in person with proof of delivery. In the event of termination, only the percent of satisfactory progress actually achieved to the date of termination plus any non-cancellable obligations will be due and payable to the University.

If the University Project Director becomes unable or unwilling to continue project activities under this Agreement and a mutually acceptable substitute is not available, SPONSOR has the option to terminate this Agreement.

VI. PUBLICITY: Neither party may use the name of the other party or its employees in any publicity, advertising, or news release without the prior written approval of an authorized representative of that party. Under the provisions of Florida Statute 1004.22, the University is required to make available upon

request the title and description of a research project, the name of the researcher, and the amount and source of funding provided for the project.

VII. CONFIDENTIALITY: In the course of performing work under this Agreement, it may be necessary for either party to disclose to the other certain confidential/proprietary information or data. All such confidential information will be clearly marked or identified as confidential at the time of disclosure; if given orally, it will be reduced to writing, marked as confidential, and provided within 30 days.

Each party agrees to hold the other's confidential information in confidence from date of disclosure until three years from the date it is either returned to the disclosing party or destroyed, at the option and request of the disclosing party. The parties will take reasonable precautions to avoid disclosure, publication, or dissemination of confidential information and will use confidential information only in connection with the project.

No obligation of confidentiality applies to any information that was already in the receiving party's possession prior to its receipt from the disclosing party; is or becomes publicly known or available through no breach of this Agreement by the receiving party; is acquired by the receiving party from a third party without notice or restrictions of confidentiality; is independently developed by or for the receiving party's personnel to whom the providing party's confidential information had not been disclosed; or is required to be disclosed by law or governmental regulation, in which case both parties will work together in order to comply with such requirement.

VIII. PUBLICATION: Sponsor recognizes that under University policy the results of the project must be publishable and agrees that the University Project Director or University employees engaged in the project are permitted to present at symposia and professional meetings and to publish in journals, theses or dissertations, or otherwise of their own choosing, the data, methods, and results of the project.

IX. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY: The University Project Director will promptly disclose all intellectual property ("IP") generated during the course of this Agreement to University's Technology Transfer Office ("TTO") in accordance with USF Policy 0-300 on Inventions and Works, and the TTO will promptly disclose the IP to Sponsor.

University owns all IP conceived or made by the University Project Director or any other University employee. Sponsor owns all IP conceived or made by employees of Sponsor. University and Sponsor jointly own IP conceived or made by employees of University and Sponsor.

Any background IP and technologies of Sponsor, the University, the University Project Director, or any other University employee existing prior to the execution of this Agreement are their own separate property, respectively, and are not affected by this Agreement. Neither party acquires any claims to or rights in any background IP or technologies of the other by virtue of this Agreement.

X. GOVERNING LAW: Florida law, without reference to choice of law rules, governs the enforcement, interpretation, and construction of this Agreement.

XI. DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY: This Agreement is valid and enforceable only upon signature by persons authorized to bind Sponsor and by all persons required by Florida law or University policy in order to bind the University.

XII. PROTECTION OF HUMAN SUBJECTS: The University bears full responsibility for the proper and safe performance of research involving the use of human subjects under this Agreement. If human subjects are used, their rights and welfare will be protected under 45 CFR Part 46, "Protection of Human Subjects," and the University will send a copy of current IRB approval to Sponsor.

Title: Distributed Air Quality Monitoring for Disadvantaged Communities Along I-275/I-4 Corridor

Overview:

Traffic-related air pollution is an important community health problem, leading to excess mortality, increased health costs, and loss of work productivity. Furthermore, evidence from around the U.S. indicates that historically marginalized populations are disproportionately affected by traffic-related air pollution. Studies of Hillsborough County show that African Americans and households living in poverty bear the burden of high exposures. Specifically, neighborhoods near the I-275/I-4 corridor, many of which are primarily comprised of people of color and lower-income residents, likely experience some of the highest levels of traffic pollution.

Transportation planning provides opportunities to reduce traffic-related air pollution and resulting inequities. To enable planning approaches that improve air quality in communities near roadways, better ongoing data are needed on exposures in these communities. Although the current network of regulatory air quality monitoring sites provides high-quality ambient pollution data, it is too sparse (with only one near-road monitoring site) to provide the local-scale neighborhood exposure levels that are needed to improve the equity outcomes of transportation decision making. Furthermore, populations in marginalized communities are often distrustful of government data and feel disempowered to contribute to planning decisions. Hence, it is important for people in communities of concern to both understand the impacts of air quality and to be empowered to influence sustainable solutions to community air pollution.

The project described here is a continuation of pilot work to investigate the use of next-generation lower-cost sensors for characterizing affected community air quality in Hillsborough County. As a part of this pilot work, a collaboration between the Transportation Planning Organization (TPO), University of South Florida (USF), Environmental Protection Commission (EPC), and several community organizations was formed. Based on this work, the partnership developed a proposal submitted by the TPO to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to expand and continue the work on distributed community air quality monitoring. This document (including the scope and budget for the subcontract to USF from the TPO) describes USF's planned contributions to that funded EPA project.

Scope and methods:

Through this project, USF will collaborate with the TPO on the EPA-funded project titled "Distributed Air Quality Monitoring for Disadvantaged Communities Along I-275/I-4 Corridor". The objectives of the project are to:

- 1. Establish a network of air pollution monitors in underserved neighborhoods near the I-275/I-4 corridor,
- 2. Characterize concentrations of the target traffic-related air pollutants in these communities, and
- 3. Develop community capacity for civic engagement and empowerment on issues of air pollution and built environmental design.

USF's role in the project will be to provide technical expertise and student workforce capacity through dedicated time on the project as detailed in the Budget Narrative.

The USF team's primary activities will include:

<u>Developing quality assurance plans</u>. Environmental data collected for the purposes of decision making requires the development (and regular review) of a Quality Assurance Project Plan (QAPP). The QAPP details the quality assurance processes involved in measurement and ensures that the quality of the data collected is appropriate for planned uses. (A QAPP is also a required component of the EPA grant.) The USF team will collaborate with the TPO and other

- project partners in a systematic planning process for the development (and review) of a QAPP that is appropriate to the purpose and nature of the distributed community network using low-cost devices. This will include developing protocols and plans for routine monitor maintenance, network calibration, and quality control.
- Selecting monitoring equipment. Based on USF's pilot project work, two monitors (the Purple Air II and Clarity Node-S) were selected for community deployment to measure particulate matter (PM) and nitrogen dioxide. Several of these monitors will be deployed at community sites for the EPA grant. For installation of the Purple Air II at many community sites, systems that supply power and internet will be required. The USF team will collaborate with the TPO to select appropriate equipment. Additionally, benzene is a third target pollutant for the EPA grant. The USF team will collaborate with the TPO and EPC to select and install benzene monitor(s) at community site(s), if required.
- <u>Deploying and maintaining monitors</u>. As a part of the EPA grant, monitors must be installed at numerous community sites. Further, to ensure quality measurements over time, the installation will need to be maintained through remote surveillance of data and physical visits to the sites.
 The USF team will assist the TPO and site hosts with these deployments and site maintenance.
- Compiling and analyzing data from the community monitors. The community monitors collect
 and store near-real-time data on levels of the select air pollutants at each monitoring site.
 However, for quality assurance and interpretation, the data must be compiled, aggregated,
 statistically analyzed, compared with data from regulatory reference monitors and from other
 community monitors, and described in graphical and written forms. The USF team will perform
 these activities for the distributed network monitors (including those already installed through
 the pilot project) to support reporting to the EPA, TPO, community partners, and the public on
 site air quality, data quality, and network needs.
- Developing a guidebook and training on community monitoring skills. To establish a sustainable distributed community network, site hosts and other involved community members must become largely self-sufficient in monitor operation and maintenance, as well as data collection and analysis. The USF team will help the TPO with technical education and outreach to develop a guidebook and other training materials to facilitate this capacity in the community. Work will also include leading training and train-the-trainer workshops coordinated by the TPO and project partners for site hosts and other interested community members on air pollution concepts and science; monitor deployment, operation, and maintenance; and data analysis and interpretation.
- Providing educational and outreach opportunities for the community. To empower marginalized communities in environmental decision-making, multi-way educational interactions between government, university, and community partners on the topics of air quality, urban planning, and equity related to transportation are needed. The USF team will help the TPO provide education and outreach to develop events and activities with community and school groups aimed at such interaction and outreach. This will include working with schoolteachers and the Community Consultant (coordinated by the TPO) to compile and develop educational materials (such as lesson plans) that provide students an opportunity to learn about air quality, transportation planning, the STEM fields, conducting research, and civic engagement. The USF team will also lead (speak and/or facilitate) at some community educational events. This includes providing a speaker (or speakers) for an annual summit/workshop for the involved communities and the interested public.
- <u>Preparing dissemination products.</u> The USF team will document the data analyses and other USF subcontract activities in an annual report (each year) for the TPO, and will support the TPO with

the quarterly EPA reports. We will also develop and provide a presentation annually on the data analyses and other USF subcontract activities for the community summit. Finally, we will prepare at least one academic conference abstract, presentation, or journal paper each year for dissemination of project activities and findings to a broad national and international audience of practitioners and researchers involved in urban planning and air quality work.

Outputs and Outcomes:

Outputs of this project will include:

- Deployment of equipment to conduct air quality monitoring in or near communities of concern near the I-275 / I-4 intersection and nearby corridors,
- Near real-time air quality data available on-line for communities and other stakeholders,
- Compiled data products (data visualizations, presentations, and reports) on levels of trafficrelated air pollution in the target communities. This will include community-specific assessments of air pollution data useful for influencing future transportation and planning projects,
- Compiled information and products (data visualizations, presentations, and reports) on the community network's data quality, necessary for appropriate decision-making and planning,
- Processes and materials (a site-host guidebook, educational/training materials, and a QAPP) for sustainability of the distributed community air quality monitoring network, including quality assurance protocols (for calibration, maintenance, and quality control).
- Academic conference abstracts, presentations, and a journal paper for broad dissemination of project activities to practitioners and scholars.
- Promotion of local partnerships and community involvement through various activities and information exchanges.

Outcomes will include improved awareness and understanding by people in communities of concern in Hillsborough County on the impacts of vehicle emissions and urban planning on air quality and health in their communities. Members of the involved communities will also have increased knowledge and skills on air pollution concepts, how to deploy and maintain air pollutant monitors, and how to interpret air quality data. Further, the TPO will have increased knowledge and understanding of neighborhood air quality affected by traffic; both the TPO and EPC will also have increased understanding of the perspectives and needs of marginalized communities concerning traffic-related air pollution. Finally, there will be better data available on neighborhood air quality for use by community members and government partners (TPO and EPC) for future planning and management decisions that can mitigate air pollution caused by traffic in these communities. In the longer term, both the data from the distributed monitoring network and the collaboration established through the project (between the involved communities, the TPO, the EPC, the USF team, and other stakeholders) will enable communities of concern to be more empowered to influence future development plans and processes that affect pollution in their communities.

Project management:

The above activities will be performed by a USF team led by Professor Amy Stuart in collaboration with the TPO EPA grant Project Manager. The USF team will include Dr. Stuart, her doctoral graduate student (Yonghong Luo) and an undergraduate student assistant (with effort on the project as detailed the Budget Narrative). Members of the USF team will meet regularly (at least monthly) with the TPO EPA grant Project Manager and other project collaborators to facilitate project activities.

Deliverables:

Deliverables are listed and described below:

- Regular presentation for the TPO project management team on activities, data, and findings. This
 will occur during months that another type of presentation is not scheduled, as part of regular
 project meetings.
- 2) Presentations for community engagement events, training workshops, and meetings of TPO committees. This will include a presentation for the annual summit/workshop for the involved communities and the public. One to two presentations will occur quarterly in Years one and two. In Year three of the project, one presentation is planned each quarter.
- 3) Materials for community education and training, including writings, visualizations (graphs, pictures, and other images), and (participation in) recordings for the training guidebook, school lesson plans, and community engagement event materials.
- 4) An annual written report on the progress and findings of the USF team's activities, including maps, graphs, and tables of data derived from the community air quality monitors. A draft written report will be provided to the TPO at least 30 days prior to the end of each annual project period; each final annual report will be completed and submitted within 30 days of receiving feedback from the TPO on the draft. In year 3, the draft written report will be submitted to the TPO 60 days prior to the project completion date, and the TPO will provide comments within 30 days of receipt.

Timeline:

This project is anticipated to begin June 1, 2023, and end February 28, 2026. The timeline of primary activities occurring during each quarter of the project period is provided in the table below. The time schedule of the project deliverables is listed above.

Budget Narrative

Personnel:

Prof. Amy Stuart, PhD (University Project Director): Dr. Stuart will dedicate 5% effort (2 hours per week) to this project during year one, 3.8% effort (1.5 hr/wk) during year two, and 4% effort (1.6 hr/wk) in year three (which comprises 9 months only). She will direct and oversee USF's activities on the project and will be the responsible point of contact with the TPO and EPC. Finally, she will contribute to data collection, analysis, writing, and revising for dissemination products (presentations, reports, manuscripts), and will be a speaker for some of the community outreach presentation deliverables. Costs include prorated salary, fringe benefits (including health insurance) and life insurance.

A graduate-level research associate (Yonghong Luo) will dedicate 25% effort or 10 hours per week (half of a full GA appointment) to support this project for 10 months in year one and 12 months in year two. This is only a 10-month period (Aug. - May) in year one because Ms. Luo is currently funded through Aug. 3, 2023, on a TPO internship. Ms. Luo will be the primary worker on project tasks for USF and will coordinate USF's involvement and collaboration with the TPO, EPC, and community partners, under the supervision of Dr. Stuart. Funds budgeted are based on the current salary rate for a doctoral-level student assistant with prorated fringe benefits (including health insurance), life insurance, and tuition.

An undergraduate research assistant (TBN) will support the project for 10 hours per week in year three (which comprises 9 months only). S/he will assist in the final year activities, including the community engagement events, dissemination, and report writing. Funds budgeted are based on the current salary rate for an undergraduate assistant with prorated fringe benefits (including health insurance) and life insurance.

Other Direct Costs:

Funds are budgeted each year to contribute to USF's direct costs for materials and supplies, journal publication fees, and academic conference travel to disseminate project progress and results. We note that the funds budgeted here will not fully support these necessary activities but will help to defray a portion of these costs for the university researchers. Further, costs for the monitoring equipment, most ancillary supplies for monitoring, dissemination materials (such as outreach signage), and other community engagement costs will be incurred directly by the TPO for those components (using EPA grant funds or other funds).

Annual Certification of Metropolitan Transportation Planning Process

Summary

Metropolitan Planning Organizations are established and funded by federal and state laws and rules. Therefore, many federal and state requirements apply. The federal government evaluates our compliance every four years, and a public meeting is held at that time. The last such meeting was held in January 2021.

In between these major review events, the TPO's planning process must be certified annually following federal and state rules through a cooperative review conducted by the FDOT District 7 office and the TPO staff and Board. This concludes with a Joint TPO/FDOT Certification statement and summary of notable achievements, recommendations, and corrective actions.

Memorandum of Understanding on Creating a Tampa Bay MPO

Summary:

For about 30 years there has been a periodic discussion about forming a regional metropolitan planning organization (MPO) to serve the Tampa-St. Petersburg urbanized area that comprises most of Pinellas, Pasco and Hillsborough Counties. Whether stemming from the Governor of Florida, the business community, or local elected officials, the impetus for creating a single regional transportation planning body for the Tampa Bay area is to better harness the collective strength of the region to garner more funding from federal, state, and local sources and advance significant transportation projects to better support the region's growth and sustain its quality of life. That notion is often countered by the different needs for transportation based on geography, land use patterns and trends, and distinct socioeconomic considerations among the three counties.

With the dissolution of the Tampa Bay Area Regional Transit Authority and a sense that the Tampa Bay area is not competing effectively for funding with other regions in Florida and elsewhere, there continues to be a push to form a regional planning and decision-making body for transportation. To address these calls and draft bills filed by the Florida legislature, the staff directors of the three MPOs have worked in partnership to draft a Memorandum of Understanding that sets forth a framework and necessary steps for the creation of a regional MPO. The draft MOU puts key provisions and considerations in writing to advance the conversation toward achieving this objective in a reasonable time frame.

The Tampa Bay Transportation Management Area (TMA) Leadership Group discussed the draft MOU at its meeting on March 24th. The majority of members spoke in support of advancing the MOU, with a few revisions, to the respective MPOs and local governments for their consideration.

Creating a Tampa Bay Metropolitan Planning Organization

Memorandum of Understanding

The Hillsborough Transportation Planning Organization, The Pasco Transportation Planning Organization and Forward Pinellas

Updated Working Draft

March 27, 2023

Whereas, the Hillsborough Transportation Planning Organization (TPO), the Pasco County TPO and Forward Pinellas (the "Parties") collectively desire to create a Tampa Bay Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) to improve regional transportation planning and define regional transportation priorities by entering into the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU);

Whereas, the Tampa Bay metropolitan area of Pasco, Pinellas and Hillsborough County has a combined population of 3.5 million and is projected to grow by more than one million people over the next 20 years;

Whereas, the Pasco, Pinellas and Hillsborough County MPOs or TPOs all function within the single Tampa-St. Petersburg Urban Area that covers much of the population within all three counties;

Whereas, since 1990 the State of Florida has requested that the three MPOs in the urban area consolidate into a single MPO unless they can sufficiently justify why they need to remain separate due to their complexity, unique conditions, and diversity within the region while also fostering a strong cooperative regional transportation planning process that addresses shared data, identifying regional needs, coordinated project development, and establishment of regional transportation priorities;

Whereas, the West Central Florida Chairs Coordinating Committee is established in state statutes (now Sun Coast Transportation Planning Alliance or SCTPA) and has interlocal agreements among the six MPOs serving the broader West Central Florida region and a subcommittee known as the Tampa Bay Transportation Management Area Leadership Group (TMA LG) serving the Pasco, Pinellas and Hillsborough MPOs that establish such a regional coordination and prioritization process;

Whereas, the pending sunset of the Tampa Bay Area Regional Transit Authority (TBARTA) will leave a void in regional transportation planning and project development, without dedicated staff and a governing board assigned to advance regional transportation activities and priorities;

Whereas, the process for forming a new regional MPO involved a number of steps to create required establishing planning documents as well as changing the hosting arrangements and MPO boundaries. As there is little precedent in Florida to rely on for guidance regarding de-designating an MPO, it will be important from a federal transportation funding cashflow to have a new MPO fully up and running at such time as existing MPOs are de-designated;

Whereas, MPOs receive federal planning funds through quarterly reimbursement that come with federal and state restrictions on how those funds may be used, there will need to be a substantial and long-term local commitment to provide sustainable and flexible funding for a regional MPO to be effective:

Whereas, the Florida Department of Transportation has committed through its approved Planning Funds (PL) distribution formula in 2014 that any MPOs in Florida that merge will continue to receive the base amount of PL due to each MPO prior to the merger.

NOW, THEREFORE, IN RECOGNITION OF THE FOREGOING, the involved MPOs hereby jointly understand, agree and commit as follows:

ARTICLE 1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this MOU is to document the mutual understanding between the Parties and to set forth the terms for their cooperation.

ARTICLE 2. AGREEMENTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF THE PARTIES

- A. The Pasco, Pinellas and Hillsborough County MPOs agree to investigate the formation, organizational and governance structure of a new regional MPO to serve the urban area of Pasco, Pinellas and Hillsborough Counties as reflected by the 2020 Census, with the goal of certifying the MPO by July 1, 2027. Other key steps toward formation may occur sooner than that date.
- B. A regional MPO serving these counties will augment and enhance the current functions of the existing MPOs in the urban area as currently represented by the Pasco MPO, Forward Pinellas and the Hillsborough TPO. It is important that while a regional MPO may provide a stronger and more collaborative regional focus and planning process that at the same time the existing long range transportation planning responsibilities be maintained at the county level for sub-regional, jurisdiction focused projects to avoid creating a local void in planning and technical assistance activities.
- C. A regional MPO must reflect proportional representation on its governing board based on the population of local governments within the MPO planning boundary, consistent with Florida Statutes that place requirements on the total number of voting members and the percentage that must represent the respective Boards of County Commissioners.
- D. The governance structure of a regional MPO may include representatives of transportation agencies as voting members, but their inclusion will reduce the number of local government elected officials as voting members on the governing board.
- E. Outreach to all local governments in the Metropolitan Planning Area is an important step in the regional MPO formation process and individual MPOs will develop a coordinated presentation and engagement strategy to fully inform and seek input from all affected local governments.

- F. The formation and certification of a new regional MPO will require the creation and adoption of multiple planning, development and policy documents for the region that are consistent with federal and state laws and regulations, including:
 - a. Apportionment Plan that describes to voting representation of the MPO's regional planning boundary and member local governments
 - b. Unified Planning Work Program (a two-year budget of planning activities)
 - c. Long Range Transportation Plan (20-25 year financially feasible plan for transportation)
 - d. Public Participation Plan (how it will involve the public in decision-making)
 - e. Transportation Improvement Program (a five-year work plan for transportation projects with funding by phase)
 - f. Congestion Management Process (a strategic means of evaluating the causes and strategies for improving traffic congestion)
 - g. Title VI process and Continuity of Operations Plan (addressing ADA complaints and emergency operations)
 - h. Interlocal agreements and/or staff services agreements with one or more host agencies (if the MPO is not fully independent), and interlocal agreements to receive funding and provide planning services to any number of local governments in the region.
- G. Those planning products shall reflect the work of the individual MPOs currently in place but will need to be substantially revised and restructured to reflect the new planning boundaries of the MPO as a truly regional entity covering the tri-county urban area.
- H. The MPOs in their current formation have demonstrated competent leadership and effectiveness in planning for countywide and local transportation needs and priorities in their respective planning areas, building trust and collaborative partnerships with local community stakeholders and land use planning agencies that will need to be sustained with the formation of a regional MPO. Therefore, the regional MPO will consider staff services agreements with the planning agency in each county to support outreach and engagement as well as coordination on land use, transportation operations and safety.
- I. As each existing MPO is currently hosted by another agency, the impacts to those agencies and their staffs should be considered; the interlocal agreements with those organizations will need to be updated. Those existing host agencies may present an opportunity for continuing long range transportation planning at a county or jurisdictional level.
- J. There will be substantial start-up costs to form a regional MPO based on case study examples elsewhere in the United States requiring funding to hire staff, secure office space, purchase equipment and produce necessary planning products and administrative documents.
- K. A regional MPO will need a recurring local funding source from member agencies or the host local government to develop a budget pay for staff salaries, planning activities, facilities and other related administration costs to augment federal and state funds that are paid on a quarterly reimbursement.

L. To retain and continue to attract quality staff for transportation planning through what may be a multi-year transition period, existing staff at the time of formation of a regional MPO will be offered positions with the new MPO and with their county governments/planning agencies.

ARTICLE 3. TERM

The term of this MOU shall commence on the date the last signature is obtained ("Effective Date") and shall continue in effect until one or more parties terminates the MOU or a new MPO interlocal agreement is in place.

ARTICLE 4. TERMINATION

This MOU may be terminated upon written agreement by the Parties with a 30-day notice.

ARTICLE 5. AMENDMENTS

This MOU may be amended, in writing, at any time if the Parties agree.

US 41/CSX Grade Separation Project Development & Environment Study (440746-1)

Summary

In 2019, the TPO supported an amendment to the 2019-2023 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) adding \$1.45 million in funds for a Project Development & Environment (PD&E) Study for a grade-separation project (also known as a rail overpass) on US 41/50th St at the CSX tracks near Causeway Blvd.

This project is listed in the current 2045 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) as a major capacity project for economic growth and is a priority of the TPO. According to the *Freight Investment Program Technical Memorandum* for the LRTP, this crossing has 31 trains per day, with an average delay of 8–10 minutes per crossing. This project is considered a major investment to relieve congestion for highway and freight traffic, is located within the fastest growing portion of Hillsborough County and is of regional significance.

The project is also a statewide priority of the Florida MPO Advisory Committee (MPOAC) Freight and Rail Program, nominated by the Hillsborough TPO.

Please keep in mind that this funding total is subject to administrative takedowns and on the trust fund side a limitation on obligations, so the actual total amount available to make grants is likely to be lower than the \$160M.

The FHWA will host an informational session regarding this funding opportunity. This session will be conducted as a virtual forum and will focus on specific topics to help potential applicants gather additional information and ask specific questions. FHWA encourages potential applicants to take advantage of this opportunity to gather information regarding this specific funding opportunity.

20% non-federal match is required.

Eligible project locations include - for deployment projects include areas within or adjacent to ports and intermodal port transfer facilities. Testing and evaluation projects can be conducted anywhere but must be focused on reducing truck emissions within or adjacent to ports and/or intermodal port transfer facilities. Intermodal port transfer facilities are facilities that handle the transfer of freight shipments between two or more modes of transportation. The goods are transported via shipping containers, truck trailers, or as bulk cargo, and are transferred between marine vessels and trucks, marine vessels and rail cars, or rail cars and trucks.

Implementation of the FHWA Ferry Boat Program (Formula)

On April 21, the FHWA introduced the <u>Implementation Guidance for the Ferry Boat Program (FBP)</u>.

The purpose of the FBP is to provide Federal assistance for the construction of ferry boats and ferry terminal facilities (including ferry maintenance facilities), whether toll or free, and the procurement of transit vehicles used exclusively as an integral part of an intermodal ferry trip.

The FBP funds authorized by the IIJA/BIL will be distributed according to a formula established in law.

- 35% shall be allocated among eligible entities in the proportion that (A) the
 number of ferry passengers, including passengers in vehicles, carried by each
 ferry system in the most recent calendar year for which data is available; bears
 to (B) the number of ferry passengers, including passengers in vehicles,
 carried by all ferry systems in the most recent calendar year for which data is
 available;
- 35% shall be allocated among eligible entities in the proportion that (A) the number of vehicles carried by each ferry system in the most recent calendar year for which data is available; bears to (B) the number of vehicles carried by all ferry systems in the most recent calendar year for which data is available; and
- 30% shall be allocated among eligible entities in the proportion that (A) the total route nautical miles serviced by each ferry system in the most recent calendar year for which data is available; bears to (B) the total route nautical miles serviced by all ferry systems in the most recent calendar year for which data is available.

Subject: Legislative Update

Good morning, Governing Board members and Staff Directors. This is a little later than usual, but attached is the 2023 Legislative Session Bill Tracker spreadsheet. After Session ends, I'll send out a much more detailed summary, here is where we stand today on the primary transportation bills.

SB 1250/HB 1305, the Department's Transport Bills were brought into alignment. In a nutshell, they will accomplish the following:

- Provides that automated license plate recognition systems may not be used to issue a notice of violation for a traffic infraction or a uniform traffic citation.
- Makes the provision currently in the bill regarding airport siting effective upon the bill becoming a law.
- Authorizes DOT to enter into phased design-build contracts.
- This bill also includes provisions on temporary airports.
- Language that reinstates the Greater Miami Expressway Authority and alters the qualifications of the board.
- Includes a requirement that fixed-guideway transportation systems structural safety inspections must be done by the Department.

The Senate took up the House version, amended, then passed it. It is now in returning messages to the House.

SB 64/HB 425, the industry's transportation bills. The bills accomplish many things, but in summary they:

- Expand Florida's existing Move Over Law to include disabled motor vehicles.
- Require the Department of Transportation (DOT) to establish standards by which the State Highway System will be graded according to their compatibility with the operation of autonomous vehicles.
- Revise provisions regarding airport land use compatibility zoning regulations and noise studies at airports.
- Require DOT contracts for bridge work over navigable waters to require a marine general liability insurance provision in an amount determined by DOT.
- Require DOT to implement strategies to reduce project costs while still meeting applicable federal and state standards.
- Authorize DOT to share up to 10 percent of construction cost savings with design and engineering consultants whose input was involved in realizing the cost savings.
- Provide that stipends paid by DOT to nonselected design-build firms that have submitted responsive proposals for construction contracts, which stipends are contained in DOT's legislatively approved work program, are not subject to specified documentation and notification requirements.
- Repeal a public records exemption for documents that reveal the identity of a person who has
 requested or obtained a bid package, plan, or specifications pertaining to any project to be let by DOT.
- Authorize specific information panels to be placed on rights-of-way if specified conditions are met.

- Authorize DOT to request legislative approval of a proposed turnpike project regardless of how complete the project's design phase is.
- Encourage the consolidation of and cooperation between Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs).
- Require a report regarding the consolidation of the MPOs serving Hillsborough, Pasco, and Pinellas Counties.
- Revise provisions regarding the Metropolitan Planning Organization Advisory Council (but keeps the MPOAC independent).
- Authorize DOT to use \$5 million from the State Transportation Trust Fund for workforce development.
- Require DOT to make \$20 million available each year to provide for the movement and storage of aggregate.

The House version of this bill was passed and sent to the Senate on the 26th. The Senate version has been placed on the Senate Special Order Calendar.

The Department is fully funded in the Appropriations bill at \$14.8 billion. This includes \$400.7 million in General Revenue funds allocated for local transportation projects. Please let me know if you have any questions.

To Whom It May Concern:

On behalf of the Hillsborough TPO, I am pleased to support Port Tampa Bay's **Southbay Road and Utilities** project in Hillsborough County, Florida, as a Community Funding project (under the PIDP or Port Infrastructure Development category).

The Southbay project is an expansion of Port Redwing, Port Tampa Bay's newest terminal, the area around which is building out quickly. Southbay is the second phase, the upland area, suitable for large footprint manufacturing, DCs and transload operations, and other ancillary industries. Port Tampa Bay intends to construct, on its property, a 3,300-linear-foot two-lane roadway and utilities including water, storm and sanitary, lighting, power, fencing.

The current market for port-adjacent warehousing is strong, and this \$6 million project will leverage private investment. When Southbay is fully built out, it is expected to generate in excess of 876 permanent well-paying jobs, with total earnings of more than \$55 million. About 293 will be jobs directly related to port businesses. The project is in and will support a census tract that is an area of persistent poverty. Each year, business services revenue will exceed \$58 million, \$32.8 million of local purchases will be made, and almost \$5.5 million in local and state taxes are forecast to be paid.

Port Tampa Bay is Florida's largest port in tonnage and area, and its location right next to one of the fastest growing populations in the US, Tampa Bay, makes its expansion doubly important. Using a port as close as possible to the cargo origin or destination helps reduce truck miles on Florida's overburdened highways, versus using a more distant port. As a result, this project contributes to a better environment. Fewer truck miles travelled will cut emissions, enhance roadway safety, and enhance economic benefits. This benefits the Tampa Bay region, the state and the nation.

Further, Port Tampa Bay is an economic engine of this region, and is an anchor of the Central Florida Mega-region's cluster of logistics-led businesses along the I-4 corridor-comprising 200 square miles of such businesses. Our TPO's *Hillsborough + Polk Freight Logistics Zone Strategic Plan* documents the significance of this business cluster to the state's economy as well as to our residents' access to living-wage jobs. Thus, strategic investments in transportation facilities supporting Port Tampa Bay will have broad and far-reaching benefits for prosperity.

Dear Mike,

On April 12, 2023, the Hillsborough Transportation Planning Organization established performance targets for the Pavement & Bridge Condition and System Performance Rules to comply with the requirements of the MAP-21 and FAST Act.

The Hillsborough TPO agreed to support FDOT's statewide pavement & bridge condition targets, while electing to set its own system performance targets for travel time reliability, as indicated below:

- ≥65.6% Interstate Travel Time Reliability
- ≥90.1% Non-interstate NHS Travel Time Reliability
- ≤1.94Truck Travel Time Reliability Index

With this action, the TPO is agreeing to plan and program projects in the Transportation Improvement Program that will, once implemented, make progress toward achieving the adopted targets.

We support the efforts of FDOT to implement performance-based planning and programming. We believe that these measures provide a uniform calculus by which to identify both strengths and weaknesses of the national transportation system, to increase accountability and transparency of the Federal-Aid Highway Program, and to improve decision-making through performance-based planning and programming.

In recognition of the exemplary efforts made by FDOT District 7 to maintain NHS pavements & bridges in a condition which exceeds the statewide target, we write to request that our District 7 partners continue to maintain these vital assets in a good state of repair. We also request that funding be made available in the FDOT Work Program to support operational and other improvements which may alleviate bottlenecks and improve travel time reliability on the National Highway System. A number of projects which could make a difference, and which are ready for funding

and implementation, are identified on the Hillsborough TPO's Transportation Improvement Program priority list, which is attached for reference.

The Hillsborough Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) supports the Tampa Bay Regional Planning Council's (TBRPCs') grant application to be submitted to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for the Climate Pollution Reduction Grant (CPRG) Program. Our understanding is that TBRPC will submit a Notice of Intent to Participate for the CPRG program to serve as the lead agency with oversight and responsibility for managing grant funds and coordinating activities and deliverables for the program.

The Hillsborough TPO is a member of the Sun Coast Transportation Planning Alliance which includes the Tampa – St. Peterburg – Clearwater Metropolitan Statistical Area. The SCTPA works as a region to prepare plans, studies, and priorities for regionally significant projects, review the impact of significant land-use decisions, share current travel data and trends, and adopt regional transportation plans and priorities for highway, public transportation, and multi-use trail improvements. These efforts can be useful to the development of the Comprehensive Climate Action Plan as part of the CPRG program.

Further, the Hillsborough TPO currently has two projects identified in our Unified Planning Work Program that can inform the development of plans to help reduce greenhouse gas emissions and identify areas potentially affected by air pollution in Hillsborough County. The TPO's Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Plan (EVIP), currently in development, will identify locations where EV infrastructure can be deployed, provide a framework for prioritizing charging stations, and provide policy guidance on implementing compatible land use codes. The TPO's Low-Cost Air Quality Monitoring Pilot Study, also currently ongoing, establishes a network of Community Air Monitoring sites to measure air pollution in communities disproportionately impacted by transportation related air pollution. This latter project is being expanded with support from an EPA Enhanced Air Quality Monitoring for Communities grant awarded to the Hillsborough TPO this year.

We are excited to work with the TBRPC in a regionally coordinated effort to improve air quality and reduce pollution for the residents of Hillsborough County and Tampa
