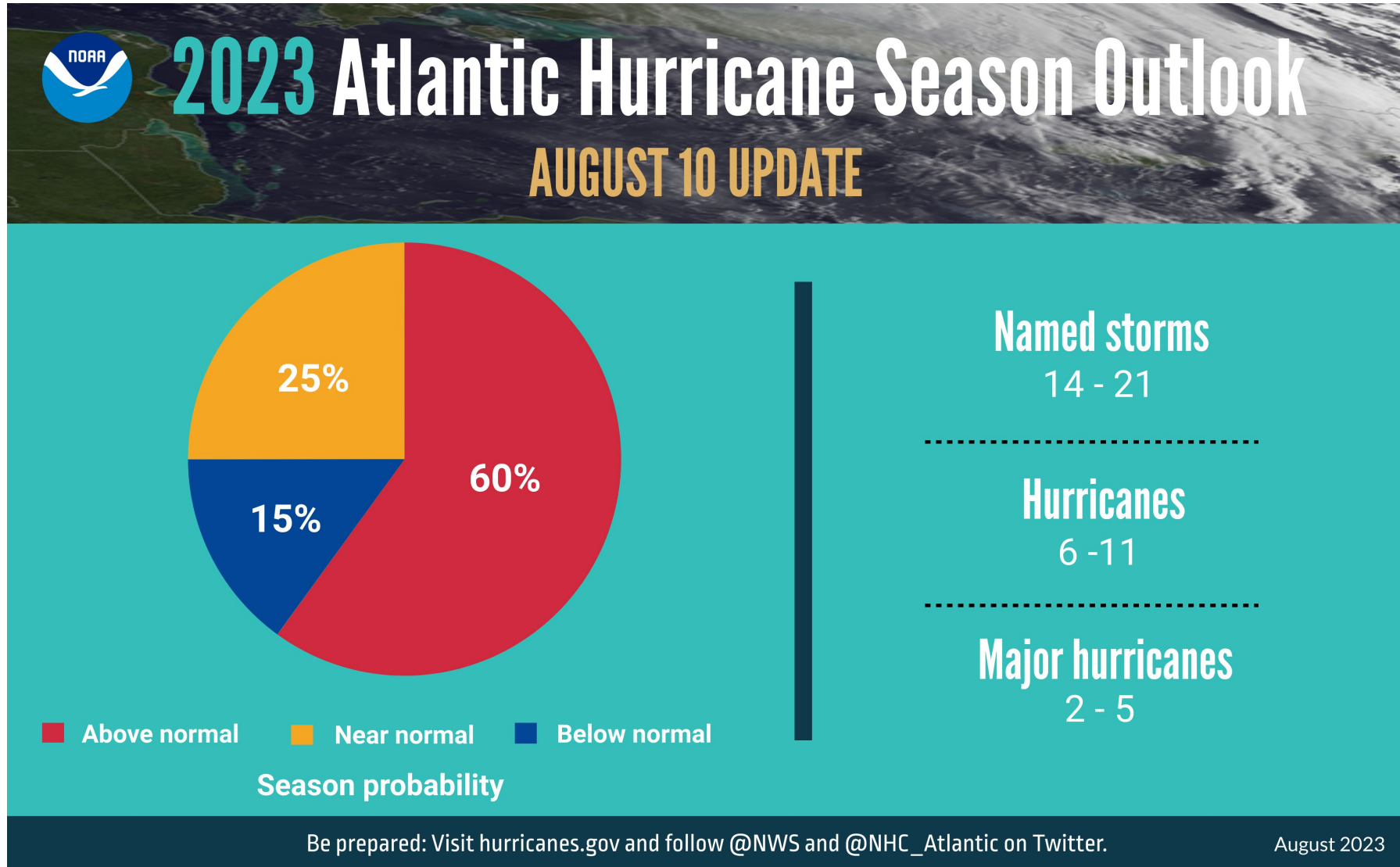

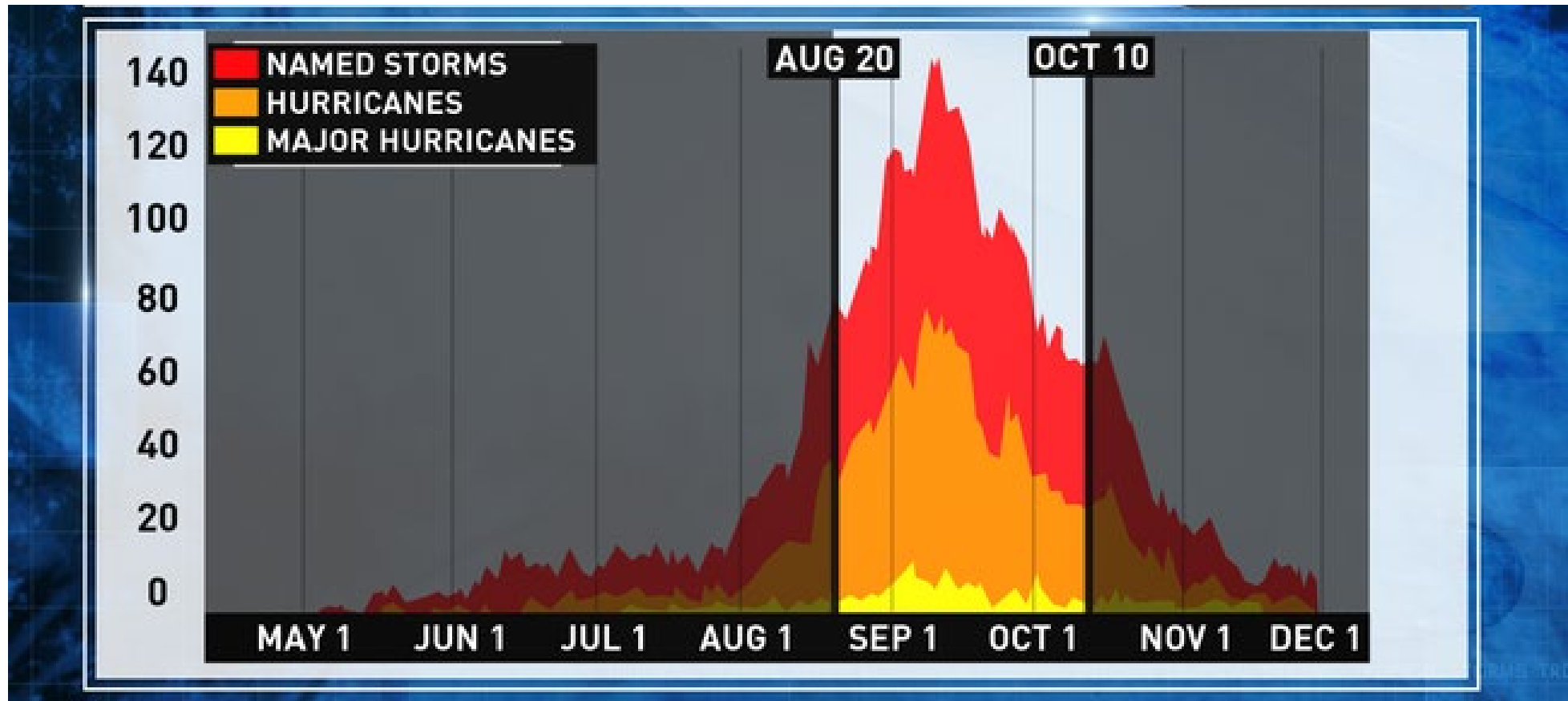

Peak of the Season



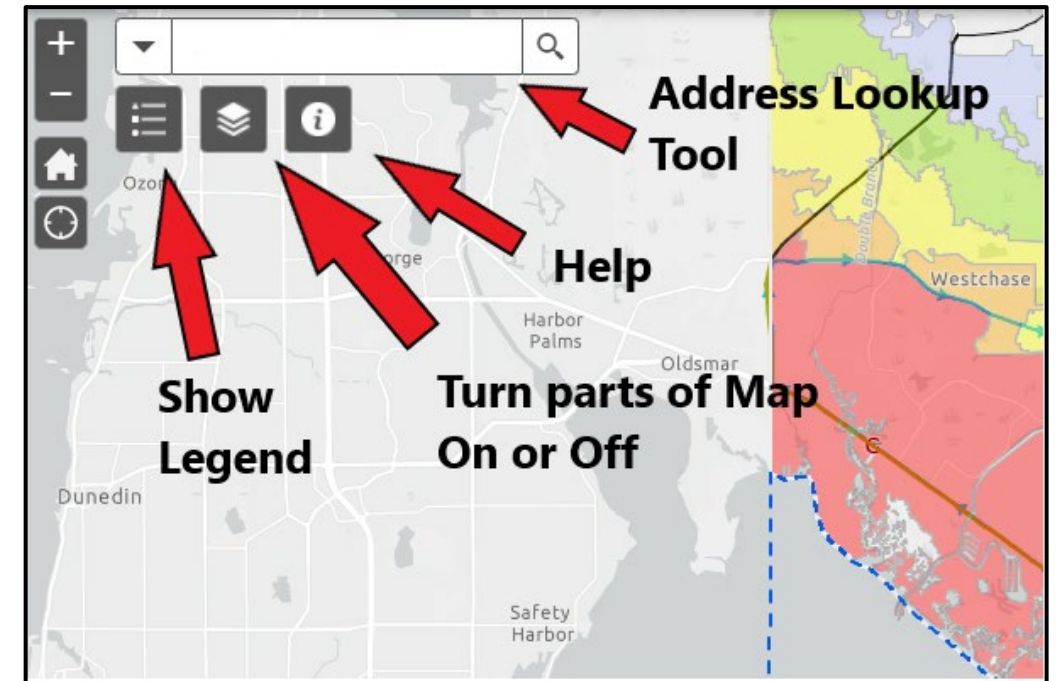
Evacuation Working Group (EWG)

- ❑ Comprised of various transportation partners to include:
 - HART
 - Sunshine Line
 - HCPS
 - HCFR
 - AMR
 - AmeriCare
 - Transcare
- ❑ EWG utilizes a Hub & Spoke Model during emergency evacuations
 - 4 Transit/Transfer Centers
 - HCPS transports from centers
 - Process is done in reverse for demobilization

Hurricane Evacuation Assessment Tool (HEAT)

The Hurricane Evacuation Assessment Tool (HEAT) assists Hillsborough County residents in determining if they are in one of the five evacuation zones. It also provides information on shelters. Search evacuation information by owner name, address, or parcel using HEAT.

Florida Sales Tax Holiday

DISASTER PREPAREDNESS SALES TAX HOLIDAY AUGUST 26 - SEPTEMBER 8

Purchase qualifying disaster preparedness supplies tax-free

\$10 or less

- Cans or pouches of wet pet food

\$15 or less

- Manual can openers
- Collapsible or travel-size food and water bowls for pets
- Cat litter pans
- Pet waste disposal bags
- Hamster or rabbit substrate

\$20 or less

- Reusable ice
- Leashes, collars and muzzles for pets
- Pet pads

\$25 or less

- Cat litter

\$30 or less

Common household consumable items:

- Laundry supplies: Laundry detergent, fabric softener, dryer sheets, stain remover and bleach
- Toilet paper and paper towels
- Paper napkins, tissues, facial tissues
- Handsoap, bar soap and body wash
- Sunscreen and sunblock
- Dish soaps and detergents: powder, liquid or pod detergent, dishwasher rinse agents
- Cleaning or disinfecting wipes and sprays
- Hand sanitizer
- Trash bags

\$40 or less

- Portable self-powered light sources
- Pet Beds

\$50 or less

- Portable self-powered radios, two-way radios or weather-band radios
- Gas or diesel fuel tanks
- Batteries, including rechargeable batteries:
 - AA-cell
 - AAA-cell
 - C-cell
 - D-cell
 - 6-volt
 - 9-volt

\$60 or less

- Nonelectric food storage coolers
- Portable power banks

\$70 or less

- Smoke detectors or smoke alarms
- Fire extinguishers
- Carbon monoxide detectors

\$100 or less

- Tarpaulins or other flexible waterproof sheeting
- Ground anchor systems
- Portable pet kennels
- Over the counter pet medications
- Bags of dry dog or cat food

\$3,000 or less

- Portable generators used to provide light or communications or to preserve food in a power outage (*Never use a generator indoors.*)
