#### **FACT SHEET – Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP)**

What it is: A federally required document that lists planning projects, including those that are required and requested by partner agencies. It is the TPO's two-year budget and follows the State fiscal year, July 1 – June 30. The UPWP under development is for July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2026.

<u>What it contains:</u> Critical Path Projects are those that are required by state and/or federal statute and those that continue from the current fiscal year. Other projects, including planning and analysis requested by partners, organized by task.

Tasks include plans, studies, projects and support services covering \* corridor studies \* congestion \* safety \* ITS projects \* resiliency \* complete streets \* active transportation \* intermodal \* freight \* transit \* transportation demand management \* Transportation Disadvantaged planning \* environmental requirements \* Long Range Transportation planning \* Data collection & analysis \* planning on a local, regional and state-wide scale \* Public participation and outreach \* Administrative \* Shared regional planning \* Exploration of a regional MPO

**Schedule:** April – Draft UPWP shared with committees and posted on website. May – TPO Board approval and submittal to FDOT by May 15th. July 1, 2024 – New UPWP becomes effective/ Current & Draft UPWP may be found at: <u>Unified Planning Work Program - Plan Hillsborough</u>

**DBE:** State goal is 10.65% TPO Current 2-year avg. 13% for eligible DBE projects

# FY 23/24 Funding De-obligation Summary



- FY 2023 & FY 2024 UPWP effective until June 30, 2024.
- Unused FHWA funds must be de-obligated by May 1st
   & transmitted to FDOT by through amendment.
- Tasks 1,2,3,5,6 have some funds de-obligated.
- De-obligated funds become available in fiscal year(FY25).

Total funding de-obligated \$650,350



De-obligation amounts are generally due to personnel changes (such as retirements & resignations) and project timing. Examples of projects which will conclude *after* June 30<sup>th</sup> are:
