I. Call Meeting to Order

Commissioner Myers called the meeting to order at 9:30 AM.

- III. Approval of Minutes (Timestamp 0:01:53) –June 28, 2024

Councilmember Schisler moved to approve the minutes from June 28, 2024, seconded by Glenn Brown. The voice vote passed unanimously.

IV. Action Items

- A. Agency for Community Treatment Services, Inc. (ACTS) Coordination Contract (Karen Smith, Sunshine Line) (*Timestamp 0:02:12*)
 - Contract is expiring and went over why the contract is necessary
 - Reviewed the population served by this company and the programs provided
 - Went over vehicles they have
 - Looked at the number of trips provided, and the cost associated

Recommended Action: Approve the new coordination contract with ACTS

There was a motion and second to approve the new coordination contract with ACTS. The voice vote passed unanimously.

V. Status Reports

A. Access2050 Plan: Draft Cost Feasible Plan (Lauren Brooks, AECOM) (Timestamp 0:03:55)

- Provided context of the purpose of this plan
- Reviewed public engagement and timeline
- Looked at what makes up the Cost Feasible Plan Ingredients: environmental considerations, funding sources & scenarios
- Went over the preferred scenarios, and scenario two was chosen
- Went over the proposed allocation of funding based on the available revenues
- Looked at Major Projects those are required to be listed out and funding sources identified
- Reviewed the additional investment program performance outcomes; can be met with existing dollars
- Went over the TPOs roles in funding decisions
- Currently seeking input on the Access 2050 Cost Feasible Plan; it is available online; hoping to have it adopted in October
- B. Section 5310 Grant Program Update (Dave Newell, FDOT) (Timestamp 0:19:08)
 - Overview of D7/5310 Service Boundaries 40+ agencies across 5 counties, limited annual FTA funds, D7 works with agencies to determine most critical needs
 - Went over 5310 Grant Program guidelines seniors, people with disabilities, what is not allowed
 - Looked at the timeline for the 5310 award process 18 months on average
 - Reviewed D7 long-term commitment 5310 role of FDOT (FTA Recipient) reviewing applications, conducting risk assessments, training on 5310 application process, managing grants and awards, participating in Triennial reviews
 - Went over the 2024/25 FY cycle highlights 24 applicants district-wide, Hillsborough had 5, Tampa Urbanized Area has \$4,208,077 (FTA)

Discussion:

When are applications open for this process? Between October and the end of January. How many agencies are 5310 recipients, and is there a list? Sunshine Line doesn't receive 5310 funding but maintains contracts with agencies that do. There was a discussion regarding operating examples and vehicle examples.

C. Vision Zero Streets Study – Sligh and Waters Avenue (Lisa Silva, TPO Staff) (Timestamp 0:37:53)

- Reviewed the streets in the study High Injury Network, county-owned in the City of Tampa, and how they were identified
- Went over the types of crashes on each corridor and the types of crashes and time of day
- Did a field visit of each corridor
- Went over the challenges of each roadway
- Looked at the key concepts of Vision Zero Safety, Designing for vulnerable users
- Went over the tier system used by the county
- Reviewed the community input and summary of the survey for likes, dislikes, what is missing, key values
- Went over recommendations six options, scored in modeling, the two-lane and two-lane with refuges scored the best; after all factors measured, the two-lane with the refuge option with bike lanes
 - Could be accomplished with restriping for Stage 1

- Speed reduction is recommended
- Future consideration both roads go up to I-275, traffic analysis would require additional analysis
- Added additional changes that could happen
- D. **Sunshine Line** (Jerry Stickney, Sunshine Line) (*Timestamp 0:47:24*)
 - Went over the grant year totals; requested more funds for the new year, intending to grow the program
 - Looked at operating stats for the last three months; once they hit 2 vacancies, they begin recruiting; the call center had higher turnover in July, working to improve the quality
 - Reviewed the growth of the program; had to terminate the contract for the new scheduler software, awarded a new contract, and showed a video about the software company
 - Offered a site visit to any Board members who are interested

Discussion:

It was asked if the software would bring in the taxi service if necessary. Right now, there is no taxi contract, but that is the plan once the scheduler is deployed and working. It was revealed how the Al-based software will change the dispatcher's role. They are going to work that through and will be monitored by humans. There was a question about why the trip count in July was down. A holiday contributed. There was additional conversation around the trip counts. Sunshine Line was requested to provide a little more information for the stats so board members can explain them when others ask. An FAQ will be provided at the next meeting. There was a discussion about how the committee can make a broad statement about how the TD population can be advocated for on other committees and how this work plays in.

- E. HART Update (Jesus Peraza Garcia, HART Staff) (Timestamp 1:11:42)
 - On-time performance has been running in the high 90's
 - There are less trips during the summer months due to vacations and school being out
 - The same trends occur with paratransit trips
 - Cancellations also follow the trend, particularly with subscription trips
 - Very late trips have decreased significantly over the summer, under 10 trips per month
 - Talked about the taxi trips
 - Working on scheduling for Sunday trips as well

Discussion:

There was a discussion about completed trips between HARTPlus and Taxis.
